Today, 12th February 2021 is a very special day in the history of Ewhurst School, as exactly 175 years ago The Trust Deed was signed by the Rector and church wardens to establish a permanent school on this very site. In fact, Ewhurst School is one of the oldest schools in Surrey to still use the original buildings. Education has been provided in Ewhurst through close links with the parish church since the early 18th century when a charity school was set up during the ministry of William Whitfield, Rector of Ewhurst from 1693-1715. In 1822 the school became a national school. From 1833 government grants were available to schools sponsored by The National Society towards the cost of school buildings and from 1841 applicants were required to adopt a trust deed, stating the permanent dedication of the site to the purposes of education and allowing the right of government inspection. Revd Cooper gave Glebe land for the building of a new school and applied for a grant from the National Society in June 1845. After a delay due to the sudden death of Revd Cooper, The Trust Deed was signed on 12th February 1846. It is our intention to celebrate this event in a number of ways. Later this term the children will be making audio recording and videos of life in our school today. I also invite former pupils to make a video or audio recording of memories of their time at Ewhurst School. I hope that we can create a social history archive for future pupils to enjoy. There is an article in News & Views and also you will find further information and photos on the school website under News and Events. Learning from Home Questionnaire Review

Thank you to everyone who has taken the trouble to complete the questionnaire. The staff have appreciated so many positive comments from you. However, we also recognise that not everyone finds Microsoft Teams easy to navigate. We are, at times equally frustrated with the fluctuation in local internet connection. To give you a little additional context; so much is also new to us and we are all learning and persevering together. We try our very best to troubleshoot our issues and issues that you have at home as fast as we are able. Currently, our staffing capacity has reduced by nearly 50% for a number of reasons to a skeleton level to enable the school to keep open for critical worker, SEN & vulnerable children. As a result, every member of the team who is able to work on site is required to, both in support of teaching and learning in school and at home. In addition, all staff undertake extra roles in following strict sanitation protocols which take up a lot of time. I have become very used to cleaning toilets each lunchtime which I have now done for six months! I am extremely grateful to the school team and the COVID governor committee for the huge amount of work required in this pandemic to support all the children and you, our families.
