We are certainly welcoming some warmer weather and hope for more soon! In Assembly we continue to look at the symbol of a rainbow as a sign of hope. The colours are representative of a range of meanings for example **Red is the colour** of love, Orange is the colour of waiting, Yellow is a happy colour, can think about or be thankful for things that make you happy today? Green is the colour of new growth, can think of a news skill you wish to learn this term? Blue is a peaceful colour, can think about how you might be a 'peacemaker' today? Indigo is a sad colour: think or pray about someone who is sad, or ill, or lonely, Violet is a royal colour, the colour of leaders: what good decisions will you make today? Cherry class are making into a display with examples for everyone to see.

The well-being of all our pupils continues to be a focus and this week we are looking at developing resilience further. One of our school values is perseverance so the children learn over time what this means in learning new skills. In Apple class, the children have been persevering with throwing and catching skills along with extending their writing with traditional tales. In Holly Class, the children have enjoyed testing materials, planning and building their pirate ships. This has needed a lot of perseverance and resilience as the materials that they chose were sometimes difficult to attach. The children have also been writing the whole story of 'The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch' which has needed a lot of concentration for a sustained period of time. The children have also felt challenged with their maths, learning new concepts and not giving up when it gets tricky. Cherry class have needed to persevere with measuring problems to solve in maths this week. They have also needed resilience to write a story independently for a sustained length of time.

This week in Assembly with Rev. Clare we remembered Ascension (going up) Day when Jesus went home. We look forward to leaning about the gift of the Holy Spirit and Pentecost next week.

In line with the government policy, facemasks are no longer


required for staff in classrooms. We still await government guidance to reduce protocols further.

## Golden Boot Challenge: June 7<sup>th</sup> to 2<sup>nd</sup> July

We are again taking part in this challenge organised by Surrey County Council this year, as we have for the last eight years. It is run in a way that makes it possible for everyone to take part - every day each child will be asked how he or she travelled to school, and the aim is to engage families to consider 'greener' ways of safely travelling to school. A point is awarded to each pupil who walked, scooted, cycled or travelled by public transport to school. We are aware that some pupils have no alternative to the car, and each pupil who used car share or park 'n' stride/scoot/cycle also scores a point. This is a popular option - parking at one end of the village (not from the village car park!) and either walking/scooting/cycling the remaining distance. The 'Golden Boot' trophy will be awarded to the class who changes the most to greener options used to travel to school. Please make sure that bicycles and scooters are stored safely near the library door.

### Hot weather

Please make sure that your child has a water bottle in school every day. Sun hats (named) are essential this term. Please try to ensure that suncream (long lasting), if needed, is applied **before school. At this time, we continue to limit the number of items children bring into school. As in our sun policy, children need to apply suncream independently.** Children are encouraged to play in the shade, but the amount of shade cover is limited in the playground. After half term it is anticipated that Apple class will use the Jubilee Garden for lunchtime play.
