Learning to read is one of the most important things your child will do as part of their early It is vital that reading is taught education. consistently and that the same approach is used in all year groups. The DfE have also said that all schools must use a fully systematic synthetics phonics programme approved by them. This is why we have moved to Essential Letters and Sounds (ELS) as our phonics programme across the school.

Parents often report that they are not sure how to pronounce sounds correctly, often because they were taught very differently. However, ELS have made two videos which you can watch at your leisure and will guide you through how we say the sounds. They can be found with these two links:

In the meantime I wanted you to know that we are also changing over our home reading books to ensure they match the phonics your child has learnt (a DfE requirement) which will replace our current book band scheme. 
