Dear parents/carers,

It has been a wonderful week at school with lots going on as usual. We are still receiving visits from prospective parents wanting to look at the school, in advance of the 15 January admissions application deadline. This week Apple Class had a fun Forest school afternoon. It was great to watch the children explore the Jubilee Garden looking for different coloured items – they all seemed so interested and curious about the world around them.

Next week we are holding a Science Week, which provides more opportunities to awaken curiosity among our pupils. On Monday we will have a visit all day from Ian at Science Wizards. For the finale there will be a special event in the playground at 2.50pm and parents are very welcome to join us and watch. We will open the side gate a little earlier at 2.45pm. Science Wizards - Monday 15th January

Parents are invited to come at 2:45 on Monday afternoon to watch the finale of our Science Wizards Day on the playground. The children will be dismissed as usual at 3pm.

Pupil Premium and Free School Meals

The government provides universal free school meals for every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 in state-funded schools. However, although meals are provided free of charge, it may still be beneficial to you (if you meet the criteria) to apply for the FSM Entitlement (known as Pupil Premium). For every child in receipt of this entitlement, the school receives an extra £1455 in funding and this money is used to support that child to access free school trips, Forest Schools, swimming sessions, after-school clubs and theatre visits, and it is an important funding stream for every school. The qualifying criteria for Pupil Premium are:

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seeker's Allowance (IBJSA)
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit, provided that their annual income is less than £16,190 and they are not in receipt of Working Tax Credit.
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit.
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit
